



Currency

The unit of the Korean currency is the Won($\mbox{$W$}$). Coin denominations are $\mbox{$W$}$ 10, $\mbox{$W$}$ 50, $\mbox{$W$}$ 10,000, $\mbox{$W$}$ 500. Banknotes are $\mbox{$W$}$ 1,000, $\mbox{$W$}$ 5,000, $\mbox{$W$}$ 10,000, and $\mbox{$W$}$ 50,000. The exchange rate is approximately USD1 to KRW 1,124.60 as of March, 2012.



Climate

Korea's climate is regarded as a continental climate in terms of temperature and a monsoonal climate in terms of precipitation. The climate of Korea is characterized by four distinct seasons: Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter.



VAT

Value-Added Tax (VAT) is levied on most goods and services at a standard rate of 10% and is included in the retail price. In tourist hotels, this 10% tax applies to rooms, meals, and other services and is included in the bill.



Emergency

Electricity

In Korea, 220 volt outlets are most common. Some hotels provide 110 volt outlets for shavers. Please check the power supply before use.



Visa

All foreign visitors entering the Republic of Korea must possess a valid passport. Delegates, expect those from countries who have visa exemption agreements with Korea, should apply to a Korean diplomatic mission in their country for visas prior to departure. For details, delegates are advised to contact the Korean Embassy in their country or view the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade website at www.mofat.go.kr. Please contact the Secretariat if you have difficulties in obtaining a visa.

Geography & Location of Korea



The Korean Peninsula extends southward from the northeastern part of the Asian continent between latitudes from 33 to 43 degrees north and longitudes from 124 to 131 degrees east. Its unique geographical location this makes Korea an international hub of Asia. Mountains cover 70% of Korea's land mass, making it one of the most mountainous regions in the world.
